to provide at-risk Indianapolis youth an opportunity to foster leadership skills, develop problem solving methods, and survival tactics through a variety of programming and opportunities in the community in order to create leaders of tomorrow.

is to empower youth to become leaders through didactic and experiential activities.

is to help create a new mindset where young people learn that despite their challenges and disappointments they should "Do Something Positive - Be Someone Positive - Have Something Positive".

Our Clients:

most of our youth (ages 6- 17 from all races) are from a single female (or grandparent) head of household (living below the poverty line).

The Saint Florian Center is celebrating the 25th year of operation and has influenced over 25,000 youth leaders from around Indy. SFC Firefighters instill hope and confidence for today and tomorrow. We develop core values like honesty, good character, respect, responsibility, and time management. We improve communication, teambuilding, and analytical thinking skills. We prevent summer brain drain with hands on experiences (in leadership, science, business, philanthropy, etc.). We provide After-school homework assistance, tutoring, and drug/violence prevention training. We challenge youth through our "Readers Are Leaders" program to read and comprehend the information for pleasure. The Firefighters collaborate with organizations to host a Rites of Passage program in area schools, community centers, and churches. All of our programs work tirelessly to provide new opportunities to expand the cadet's personal growth through the year. One of our signature programs is to provide youth employment opportunities & college access training for High School students. *The SFC Leadership Program was featured in TIME Magazine.*

Indianapolis Black Firefighters Association "Christmas at the Firehouse"

The Indianapolis Black Firefighters Association (IBFA), is a non-profit organization that created and host the Annual "Christmas at the Firehouse" on the Friday before Christmas. This project reaches families that are not served by other agencies in the community. The focus is to ensure that each family member, particularly the children, experience a joyous holiday season. The families are referred by firefighters that encounter families in crisis due to fires, and catastrophic conditions. Other families are referred by community development centers, churches, and multiple community agencies. The recipients are representative of all races, colors, creeds, and nationalities. The program has been in existence for over twenty (20) years and has historically been funded by individual firefighters, private, and corporate donations. The Indianapolis Black Firefighters Association provides toys, bikes, gifts, clothing, and food items to families that otherwise would not have a Christmas for their children without our assistance. Firefighter Corey Arnold & Trasey Graham are the event chairpersons. A portion of the calendar proceeds will support "Christmas at the Firehouse".

Firefighters Local 416 "Clothe A Child"

Local 416 Firefighters select special needs families to meet at the Union Hall on a Saturday morning, eat breakfast with the firefighters, and board two buses with an escort to a local shopping mall. Firefighters and volunteers adopt a family for the day and help them purchase shoes, socks, underwear, pants, shirts, coats, and other clothing items which would be impossible without firefighter assistance. Upon our return to the Union hall Santa Claus is waiting to hear what the kids want for Christmas. He concludes the incredible day with a candy cane and toy for every child.
